They are so much better than the old machines that pin cannot keep up with the ladies sewing on the binding – with the old machines they seemed to break down either the thread or needles would break, or the stitching wouldn't be right. Now they can just sew without as many problems. Also purchased supplies and fabric with the money we received. Here are some pictures of our ladies sewing in September. Mildred Fossler has made over 100 quilt tops again this year. Rosanna Miller has made 105 of these mats for the Orphan Grain Train. It takes about 700 plastic bags to make one mat.

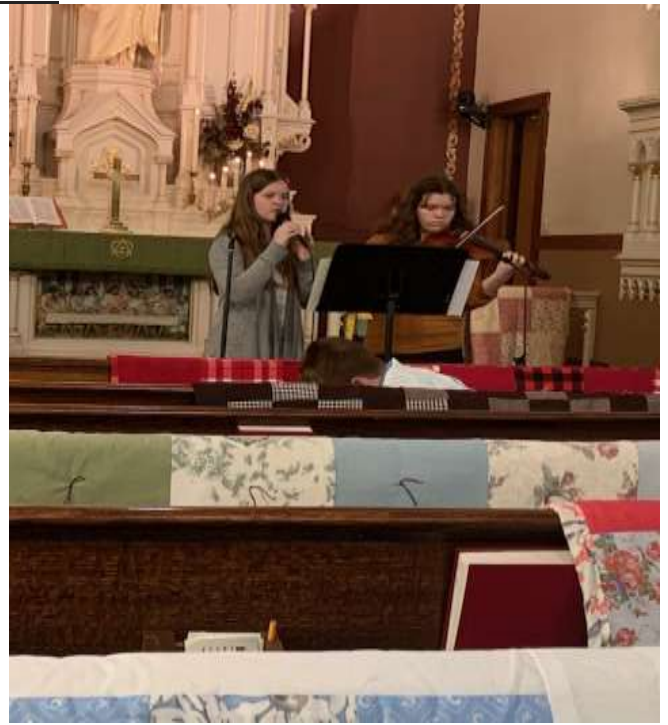

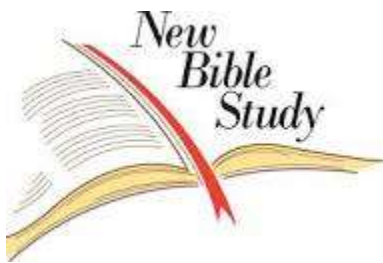

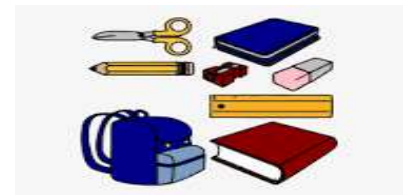
