GO AND...Be Honest (Nebraska Synod theme for the month of November)

Honesty requires vulnerability, and a willingness to really listen. Assumptions and half-truths can lead us to misunderstand the situation and story. What does reconciliation mean as we strive to move from places of misunderstanding? God calls us to be honest. Sometimes, that might look like lament or confession, and other times hymns and praise and gratitude.

Questions to consider:

- > When was a time you didn't tell the whole truth...or were not honest?
- > What piece of history should you/could you explore with a lens of honesty?
- > In what way are you being dishonest in your life?
- > **Go** and express gratitude by saying thank you to someone who deserves it.

Prayer: Reconciling God, we ask for forgiveness the times we have not reconciled our differences and acknowledged the hurts and wounds we have caused. Amen.

This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it! Psalm 118:24

Reforming thanksgiving! Two words that come to mind as we fast approach the season of Advent. Good days and bad are ALL made by God, but God doesn't label days as good or bad, we do! That is a tough lesson to learn, I know that to be true.

Reforming thanksgiving! Reformation is a revolution within Christianity that started in 1517. Depending on whom you talk to, reformation is either still happening or needs to happen again. Monk Martin Luther proposed ninety-five statements for debate about the Christian faith. With the invention of Gutenberg's printing press, Luther's Ninety-five Thesis hit Europe like a banner headline, "Pope Wrong? Monk Challenges 1,500 Years of Church Teaching!"

Reforming thanksgiving! The big question boiled down to, "How does God save people?" The Roman Catholic Church said, "God saves people by grace through faith and by good works." Martin Luther's response was/is, "God saves people by grace through faith alone." So, is the Reformation over? The Reformation slogan *Ecclesia semper reformanda*—"The church is always reforming"— states the obvious. In Christ alone we confess him to be Lord and Savior.

Reforming thanksgiving! People say, "Thanks, God," in many ways. Some people are better at it than others. In our consumption on Thanksgiving dinner and dessert, we commemorate Pilgrims—good people to be sure, but not God. Giving thanks is not something that we should save for a single day on the calendar. Giving thanks is even more than our prayers before meals. Ideally our entire lives should be an offering of thanksgiving. Maybe it's a matter of perspective. When we realize that God is the source of all things, we realize we all dependent on God.

Reforming thanksgiving! Perhaps **reforming thanksgiving** begins with our simple gratitude that God is God, **and we are not!** That is a tough lesson to learn, I know that to be true, too!
