Celebrating God's Work in Progress – Old Business

- School House Repairs and upgrades- Repairs were done to the schoolhouse addressing the water issue, and adequate upgrades were done on a new heating and air system with an addition of a dehumidifier on the new unit. A new dehumidifier was added to the parsonage system as well. New gutters and downspouts were installed on the schoolhouse. Restoration work and all new systems were acquired at \$27,905 for both buildings.
