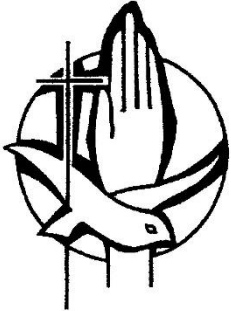

*Lector– In a time of drought, the people pray for mercy, repenting of their sins and the sins of their ancestors. They appeal to God to remember the covenant, to show forth God's power, and to heal their land by sending life-giving rain.*

As for me, I am already being poured out as a libation, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. From now on there is reserved for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have longed for his appearing.

At my first defense no one came to my support, but all deserted me. May it not be counted against them! But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. So I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and save me for his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory for ever and ever. Amen. Here ends this reading.

**SAVE THE DATE:** October 23 at 2:00 pm Gage County CROP WALK.

Starting point will be at Hannibal Park by the walking train with the Big Blue River as the destination. The 6-mile round trip walk represents the distance many people must walk each day to find food and water. This is a nationwide movement sponsored by Church World Service to raise funds to end hunger and poverty around the US and the world.

Hundreds of religious groups, businesses, schools, and others organize local walk events in their communities each year. Twenty-five percent of donations stay in the Gage Country area and benefit the Beatrice Community Food Pantry, the Wymore Food Pantry and the Salvation Army of Beatrice.

Participants are encouraged to go online

at <https://events.crophungerwalk.org/2022> and first clicking “Register” to create an account, if an account does not already exist, or “Login”.

When your account is created, you will be provided an EIN Number that will uniquely identify you.

We will start from the shelter near some playground equipment at the northeast part of Hannibal Park, proceed south on the walking trail, passing to the east of Christ Community Church, view the progress of the new elementary school groundwork, pass along the east side of the USDA building and Sacks, cross the highway at the high school, follow Scott Street to 23rd, walk along the lake by the Villa, head west through bean fields to the south side of the YMCA, pass between the cemetery and a corn field, then south of the Water Park and over to MOSAIC, followed by a pleasant stroll toward the old recycling center, then along Caldwell Street over to the Big Blue River at 6th Street. The trail will be well marked, and refreshment stations set up along the way. No one is required to walk the full distance.

## **Lutheran Youth of Nebraska (LYON) Assembly – 2022 7:00 pm Friday, November 18 to Sunday, November 20 @ First Lutheran Church, Kearney, NE**

NEW THIS YEAR: Space will be provided at First Lutheran Church for sleeping. If a group chooses to stay at a local hotel or commute, those arrangements are up to each congregation to make, and hotel costs are the responsibility of the congregation.

To register go to Nebraska Synod ELCA and click on **Lutheran Youth of Nebraska (LYON) Assembly – 2022** and follow these steps: Each youth and adult participant completes a Registration Form. The primary adult leader uses Registration Forms to complete registration online. Bring the hard copy of Registration Forms to the LYON Assembly so an adult leader from your group can have them available for emergency purposes.

Each ADULT participant must complete a Volunteer Screening Form and return it by November 4 to the synod office. If you need to request a refund, the request will be honored if emailed to the synod office by November 4.

For CANCELLATIONS, email the synod office the name of the person cancelling. If you are wanting to SUBSTITUTE one person for another, email the synod office the name of the person canceling and the name, t-shirt size, emergency contact and special needs of the person being added and acknowledgement that their covenant and medical/photo release were signed. Substitutions made after November 4 are not guaranteed a t-shirt.
